

Community Impacts in Broomfield County

- 2016 Day of Caring - 1,070 people volunteered from 35 businesses and organizations. Volunteers worked on 66 projects at 47 nonprofit sites throughout Boulder and Broomfield counties.
- Volunteer Connection Program facilitates team volunteer projects at Broomfield nonprofit organizations (most recently, a Day of Service for West Safety Services at A Precious Child).
- Volunteer Connection Program partnered with DOVIA Colorado to launch the new Boulder/Broomfield chapter of DOVIA (Directors of Volunteers in Agencies). Bringing together nonprofit volunteer managers committed to promoting the profession of volunteer management and to maintaining communication among groups working with volunteers on local, state and national levels.
- Leveraging its resilience experience in forming the Boulder County VOAD (Voluntary Organizations Active in Disasters), we are helping form a Broomfield VOAD. The Broomfield VOAD's purpose would be to unite the efforts of community, government, faith based organizations, businesses and non-profit organizations to provide collaborative support, holistic response, and effective relief to people affected by disaster in Broomfield County and surrounding communities. Foothills United Way provides free 2-1-1 help, navigation and referral services to all residents of Broomfield County.
- Our "LIVE UNITED Collaborative" status was awarded to the Westlake Middle School Collaborative. Goal -- to assure all Westlake MS students are prepared for high school and are set up for success. Through this pilot, the Westlake Collaborative will be assessing the needs of students that are not proficient in math and are facing challenges that hinder academic success.
- Founding members and active participants in the BHOC (Broomfield Housing Opportunity Coalition), originally formed as the Affordable Housing Task Force. BHOC's mission "an accessible Broomfield for a variety families and income levels" is perfectly aligned with FHUW's Attainable Housing priority.
- Awarded Boulder and Broomfield Counties Family Resource Center (FRC) Network, our first ever Emerging Partnership Planning Grant! This network is comprised of Sister Carmen



- Community Center, Emergency Family Assistance Association, OUR Center, and Broomfield FISH. Each of these four organizations represents a different demographic across Boulder and Broomfield counties. This partnership recognizes that lives don't stop and start at county lines and neither should helping others. (\$9,285 in grant funding)
