

Impact Initiatives Grants

Foothills United Way is excited to share a new funding opportunity in our community. Our *Impact Initiative Grants* are powered by the generosity of donors committed to our vision for the Boulder-Broomfield region—a community working together in which all people can achieve their full potential.

These grants are one of the many resources that Foothills United Way provides to those partnerships that have been recognized as a LIVE UNITED[®] Collaborative.

Foothills United Way is accepting proposals from recognized LIVE UNITED[®] Collaboratives only to support the following initiative costs:

- Direct program implementation
- Initiative backbone functions (including project management across partners, data collection & analysis and external communications)
- Paid staff time to coordinate collaborative program planning and service delivery

This funding opportunity is for grants of up to \$100,000 annually and for no more than 5 years. The term of the grant period will be based on the your initiative's goals.

Grant Requirements

Initiatives awarded an Impact Initiative Grant will be working with Foothills United Way on an ongoing basis during the entire grant period. Foothills United Way will be working to promote the efforts and outcomes of the initiative by utilizing the information acquired through the initiative's internal learning process. Therefore, initiatives will be required to share aggregated population data, photographs and participant testimonials with Foothills United Way for promotional use.

Finally, in order to share the experience and learnings regarding collaboration with the community, Foothills United Way will require your participation at an annual conference on collaborative health and human service delivery. This knowledge sharing will also include the participation of your initiative's members in a survey on the experience of participating in a collaborative service delivery environment.
